And as you might expect, with every passing year the need for our awareness efforts; educational programs, social support, self-management tools, and advocacy work for the rights of people with epilepsy, only increases. It is my steadfast goal and commitment to remain mission-focused, creating an environment that is ready to tackle the issues affecting the epilepsy community, while putting the organization on the most sustainable path forward.

## **OUR MISSION**

The Epilepsy Foundation of Michigan leads the fight to overcome the challenges of living with epilepsy and to accelerate therapies to stop seizures, find cures, and save lives.

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### 2016 PROGRAM IMPACT HIGHLIGHTS: HOW WE CHANGE LIVES

EPILEPSY FOUNDATION OF MICHIGAN STRIVES TO IMPROVE THE LIVES OF PEOPLE WITH EPILEPSY. MORE THAN 5,500 PEOPLE RECEIVED DIRECT SERVICES FROM THE FOUNDATION IN 2016. THE FOLLOWING EXAMPLES ILLUSTRATE THE LEVEL AND IMPACT OF THESE SERVICES:

- ➤ 100% of participants in **Project UPLIFT**, a depression self-management program, had a reduction in depression score. 50% of participants who had depression at the start of the program had a clinically significant reduction in depression score at the end of the program (defined as 5 points or more on the PHQ-9 depression questionnaire).
- ➤ 674 callers received an average of 26 minutes per call of individualized education and consultation through our *Here for You* Helpline.
- ➤ PROGRESS Toward Wellness program, an epilepsy self-management program, was reintroduced in August. A total of 148 coaching calls were made to assist 29 program participants in developing and implementing Individual Wellness Plans that focused on one or more of the following areas: Stress, Sleep, Depression, Medication Management, and Memory & Thinking.
- > 82 contacts were made on behalf of 42 clients to help resolve conflicts related to employment, education, benefits, health care, or legal rights through our **Individual Advocacy** program.
- ➤ 80% of parents said that their camper's self-esteem increased as a result of **Camp Discovery**. 89% of campers agreed that Camp Discovery helped them feel more confident in themselves and their abilities. Additionally, 95% of parents agreed that Camp Discovery increased or reinforced their belief that exercise is valuable and safe for their child.
- > 100% of participants in the **Studio E Art Therapy** program indicated that they enjoyed the program and found it to be a valuable experience. In addition, 100% of participants agreed that, after the program, they felt more capable of expressing their personality, thoughts, and emotions.
- > 88% of participants in our **Wellness & Epilepsy Conference** agreed that, as a result of attendance, they intend to make at least one positive change in their behavior to promote improved health. 86% of attendees indicated that their knowledge of epilepsy and related issues increased as a result of attending.
- Participants in our Wellness & Epilepsy Conference and our monthly **Learn & Share Conference Calls** had access to over 25 hours of educational content provided by 32 expert speakers who volunteered to share their knowledge.
- > 1,138 educators and other human service professionals learned potentially life-saving seizure recognition and first aid skills through our **Seizure Smart** training.
- ➤ 23,803 people learned more about epilepsy by visiting one or more of the six educational pages in the **About Epilepsy** section of our website.
